covered by our cleaning contract), electrical, plumbing, maintaining our sound system, painting and building decks etc. In addition to the physical labor there are people who donate the bottled water and many of the cleaning supplies used throughout our church such as dish soap, floor cleaner, toilet paper, tissues and hand soap.

We are certainly blessed to have people with the gifts and calling to help maintain our church; it is because of their good works that we do not have to use church funds to hire these jobs out or purchase these supplies.

As Jesus taught us in Matthew 6:4 in His Sermon on the Mount: "Be careful not to practice your righteousness in front of others to be seen by them. So when you give to the needy, do not announce it with trumpets, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and on the streets, to be honored by others. Financial Report - MaryAnn Conza

1/01/24 to 1/31/24 Income \$ 12,280.23 Expenses <u>17,198.63</u> (\$ 4,918.40)

January's income was less than usual; starting the year with a deficit.

For those who don't know, each year somewhere between March and June, we receive money from the Lewis Fund. Cy and Janet Lewis, who were known by many in our church, had accumulated a great deal of wealth and set up a trust fund to be split between four entities, the Reformed Church of Bushkill being one. In 2023 we received \$114,324.50. We tithe this money by giving 10% to the Deacons. That amount was \$11,432.45. The remaining amount was intended to pay the mortgage (which has been paid off), and things we need but can't afford and to fund the startup of new positions or ministries. The budget must be supported by the people of the congregation.

Let's never forget Cy and Janet Lewis and be grateful for their generosity, which is how we were able to build our Church.
