

God's Promise

Just recently we lost a close young man, actually more like an adopted son, a member of the family, a young man who would give the shirt off his back and help anyone in need. As I drove to the church office to do some work, I asked God why ... Why not me? My life was full and Matt's had just begun at the age of 31 with a wife, a daughter of eight months; life was just beginning.

I know we are not supposed to ask but we do ... we ask. So I accept God's will even though I don't understand it like all of us. We don't understand the actions of God. We do, however, trust in Him and have faith in His enlightenment and awakenings He gives us through our trials and our mishaps of life.

All we need to do is ask and He provides the comfort we seek and the awakening we need if we look to Him, the creator of life. Of life, yes of life, as even in death there is life for those who believe in Him who have fallen asleep, and those who are here still mourning as we continue with our daily living, wondering but keeping the trust and faith, putting our hurt into His hands and not ours.

Sometimes our biggest questions are ... did the person believe about God or in God? That answer sometimes and almost always lies with God Himself as once again we trust in the One who made us and who knows all.

Throughout our many conversations, one of Matt's main statement was: "Only God knows." How true! As I was pondering the questions myself as I was in the office working, or rather staring at the white wall and asking God, "Now what Lord?" As I looked more at the wall where we have three plaques hanging up with God's Word, one stood out so deeply: "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." (Jeremiah 29:11)

You know I believe that when I first read this at least for me, I think of the plans He has for me tomorrow or the next year especially when He talks about the future, but for me on this day He gave me new insight as God is not only talking about the future as we wait or hope for tomorrow but about the future we have with Him, an everlasting life, a future with God. It says "I know" (that is God himself knows). And as Matt would say "Only God knows".

Jeremiah goes on saying:

"12 Then you will call on me and come and pray to me, and I will listen to you. 13 You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart. 14 I will be found by you," declares the Lord, "and will bring you back from captivity. I will gather you from all the nations and places where I have banished you," declares the Lord, "and I will bring you back to the place from which I carried you into exile."

God's Word stands true just as I was praying to Him and seeking Him, He came to me, and I found Him. And He brought me back from my own captivity (being in my own mind dwelling in my sadness, a captivity we all face from time to time whether from loss or despair or trouble in our daily life). So even when we feel banished by Him, He will bring us back. Back to a safe dwelling, a place where we are comforted by His presence, His Word. As we go through our life and have these questions and wonder about His plan for us, let us seek Him with full heart and prayer and He will be found by us as He will hear our call.

I pray that as we all face the trials and discomforts that we go through, that we seek Him and await His answers and see His answers as we rest in His care. His promises are true!
